- · Advancement



What are Themes?

- A "veneer" that goes over learning activities to make them interesting
- A collection of related activities of high "boy interest" for each month
- Encompasses den activities & the Pack meeting
- Explained in "Program Helps", Pow-Wow and Roundtable





Why Use Themes?

- · Add Variety to Den Meetings
- Add Variety to Pack Meetings
- · Makes Den Projects More Important
- Makes planning Integrated Pack Meeting possible
- Gives variety and interest to program
- Gives initiative to do things that you would not consider otherwise
- · Increases efficiency of planning

Introducing Themes To Pack

- · Best initiated at Pack level
- Give Den Leaders long-term plan for the theme and their assignments
- Go with whatever support you get, and build - recognize Dens that support theme

- · Where do Den Crafts go?
 - Refrigerator?
 - Garbage can??
 - Pack meeting!



Program Helps - Den Level

- · Weekly layout of Den Activities
 - Gathering Activity
 - Entertainment
 - Snacks
 - Crafts/Advancements
 - Field Trips

Program Helps - Pack Level

- Den meetings form backbone of Pack Meeting
 - Den displays of crafts and activities
 - Decorations
 - Boy awareness of theme
- Make the Den projects important!



Program Helps - Pack Level

- · Pack adds additional elements:
 - Decorations
 - Guest Speakers
 - Ceremonies
 - Cheers
 - Songs
 - Cubmaster Minutes





Why have Cheers, Skits, Ceremonies, and Quotations as Part of your Program?

- · VARIETY!
- · Cheers
 - Break-up the Pack Meeting
 - Keeps things 'light'
- Skits / Songs
 - Give Dens the opportunity to Perform
 - Many Scouts love to be 'on-stage'



Why have Cheers, Skits, Ceremonies, and Quotations as Part of your Program?

- · Ceremonies
 - Scout Recognition
 - Makes it Special for the Scout & Family
- Quotations
 - Way to incorporate theme
 - Cubmaster Minute
 - Examples:
 - > "Genius is 1% inspiration and 99% perspiration." Thomas Alva Edison
 - "Throw some simple and cheap ingredients in a bag, shake it, bake it, and go to market." Guy Kawasaki
 - > "Older people ask 'What is it?' the boy asks 'What can I do with it?'"
 Apple CEO Steve Jobs

Advancements

- · Celebrate Them!
- Stress that Responsibility for Advancements lies with Family, not Den Leader
- Utilize Den Doodles, Advancement Charts, den goal to reinforce individual responsibility, track progress
- Let families know what you do not plan to cover

Planning

- Pack Committee Meeting
 - Plan Pack Meetings ahead
 - Plan Den Involvement
- · Pack Calendar
 - Gives Dens Plan for the year
 - Lists Themes
 - Lists Assignments
 - Distribute to the Families

Planning

- · Den Calendar
 - Plan the Whole Year
 - Lists Themes
 - Lists Achievements
 - Distribute to the Families



Paperwork

- Planning isn't complete without the Paperwork!
 - Permission Slip
 - > A Permission Slip is Required for each Scout for Every Outing
 - > It must be Signed buy the Scout's Parent or Guardian Prior to the Outing
 - Tour Permit
 - > Must be Filed at the Council Office Prior to the Outing

- Cubmaster's main job (ideally only job) is planning and conducting an interesting Pack meeting
- An hour a week is hype but three hours a week should be your goal
- A Scout is Thrifty and time is your most precious resource
