


CRAFTS AND ACTIVITIES

LITTER BASKET TIE SLIDE

Materials needed:
empty Jet Dry basket or film canister
pipe cleaner scrap paper
glue marker

Thread a pipe cleaner through the Jet Dry basket or through 2 holes poked in the film canister. Bend to back and fasten ends together to form the ring for the slide. Make a little sign that says LITTER and glue to the front. Fill basket with wadded paper scraps and glue them in.





TRASH NECKERCHIEF SLIDE

Materials needed: poster board various and assorted junk from around the house ½" PVC pipe hot glue gun and glue

Cut a 2 ½" circle from poster board and glue the PVC pipe onto the back for ring. Glue bits and pieces of household junk onto the front of the circle to completely cover the poster board.

POLLUTION CATCHER

Some air pollution you can see. Some air pollution you can smell. But some air pollution you can recognize only by its results. Here's a way to test for air pollution where you live:

- □ Wait for a dry, sunny day. Put a coffee filter or paper towel outside. Choose a place where the paper won't get dirty in any way other than from the air. Put the paper in a place where it won't blow away. Come back at the end of the day and see whether the paper collected dirt particles.
- □ Now, try putting papers in other places. See if papers in different locations catch different sorts of air pollution.


GROCERY BAG HOLDER


Materials needed:




DESK TOP TRASH MONSTER



POLLUTION SOLUTION COLORING BOOK







To make the flannel board, cover a large piece of plywood or heavy cardboard with light green cotton flannel (type of material used for winter pajamas.) Stretch flannel tightly across the board and thumbtack or staple gun it to the back. Bind edges with green tape. Large cutout are needed for those words shown in capital letters, below. Enlarge the designs on this page or create you own. Glue small pieces of sandpaper on the back of the cut outs to make them adhere to the flannel. As the story unfolds, place the appropriate cut outs on the flannel board.


